

READ AND UNDERSTAND THIS ENTIRE GUIDE PRIOR TO USING THIS PRODUCT

Firearms are inherently dangerous. Improper or careless use of a firearm or firearm and holster may result in serious injury or death. It is the user's responsibility to possess a thorough knowledge of, and be properly trained in, all aspects of firearm use, including holster use and safety.

Carry the firearm in the safe condition recommended by its manufacturer. This information will be contained in the product information manual provided by the firearm manufacturer. If you do not have the manual applicable to the firearm, contact the firearm's manufacturer.

It is the user's responsibility to maintain the holster by regularly checking component parts for excessive wear and proper function.

WARNING If the firearm is not properly secured by means of friction from the holsters molding or of the retention device(s), it could become dislodged, causing injury and possibly death to the user and others.

WARNING Never holster a firearm in the singleaction mode, unless it is a semi-automatic pistol and holster designed and intended for "cocked and locked" or "Condition One" carry. Always ensure that a single-action pistol carried in "Condition One" has the manual safety engaged when carrying in a holster.

WARNING Always ensure that a single-action pistol carried in "Condition One" had the manual safety engaged when carrying in a holster.

CAUTION Do not attempt to cock a holstered firearm as this may damage the firearm, the holster, or both and may contribute to a negligent discharge.

A CAUTION Always protect an exposed magazine release from accidental activation.

WARNING When drawing a firearm or engaging it with the holster, DO NOT place your finger on the trigger, in the trigger guard, or near the trigger. Position your finger along the frame of the firearm above the trigger guard. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on target.

WARNING A significant number of negligent discharges - some resulting in injury or death - occur while holstering a firearm. Most are caused by the user's index finger pressing the trigger. Some are caused because a foreign object become entangled or trapped in the trigger guard/holster and presses the trigger. The safest practice is to "look the firearm into the holster." This should be done methodically and without rushing. While holstering, be fully cognizant that:

1. All safeties are engaged.

2. Your index finger is straight along the firearm's frame. Do NOT place your finger on the trigger, in the trigger guard, or near the trigger. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on target.

3. No articles of clothing (shirt tails, jacket drawstrings, etc.) become trapped in the trigger guard, holster, or between the firearm and holster.

4. Your shooting-hand thumb is placed over the hammer or the rear of the slide. This will enable you to feel if the hammer starts to move rearward or the slide begins to come out of battery.

5. You strictly observe Rule of Firearms Safety #2: never let the muzzle cover anything you're not willing to destroy. If you do not know how to holster your firearm without breaking this rule, you should seek training before holstering your firearm while the holster is worn.

6. If for any reason you are unable to "look the firearm into the holster" and not muzzle yourself or others, you should remove the holster from your body, then "look the firearm into the holster" (without breaking Rule #2). After the firearm is securely seated in the holster, attach the holster to your body/ clothing in the manner in which it was designed.

7. If you holster your firearm while the holster is off and in your hand, insure you do NOT point the firearm at your support hand. Do not place your support hand (or other body parts) at the bottom of the holster. The holster material is not bullet proof. Neither your support hand, other body parts, nor other people should be muzzled/flagged while holstering.

WARNING A firearm (whether in or out of a holster) may discharge if it falls to the ground or onto another object, causing death or serious injury. Holsters are not designed or intended to prevent firearms from discharging when dropped.

Always place your hand on the firearm when you are performing other physically vigorous activities.

Checking tension units each time the holster is used is required as part of your regular safety inspection. Applying a small amount of clear nail polish to the threads of the tension units, after proper adjustment, will help minimize screw loosening.

WARNING Do not use customized, modified, worn or broken firearms, or those otherwise outside the original manufacturer's specifications, with a Galco holster.

WARNING Do not in any way modify, disassemble or remove any part from this holster, except as approved and recommended in Galco's Product Information Guide.

WARNING Tension units are not pre-set at the factory. If a holster has tension units, it is the user's responsibility to ensure they are adjusted to retain the firearm.

WARNING A holster is not a replacement for a safe. Firearms should be secured in a locked safe when not in use. Firearms should not be stored in holsters for long periods, even when in a safe. The holster may trap moisture against the firearm and promote corrosion.

CARRY CONDITION OF THE FIREARM

A WARNING Some single-action revolvers and some semi-automatic pistols must be carried with the hammer or firing pin resting on an empty chamber.

Carrying any firearm with a live cartridge in the chamber immediately in front of the firing pin may cause a negligent discharge. Information regarding the safe carry condition of your firearm will be contained in the product information manual provided by the firearm's manufacturer. If you are unsure of the safe carry condition(s) of your firearm, contact the firearm's manufacturer.

WARNING Do not place a loaded firearm in a holster without first testing - with a firearm double-checked and verified to be unloaded - for proper firearm fit.

PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION

Galco products are generally identified with a two - part code stamped into the holster body or label affixed to the item.

An alphabetical or alphanumeric prefix identifies the holster model. For example, the FLETCH model's prefix is FL while the Royal Guard's prefix is RG.

The numerical suffix identifies the particular firearm the holster is intended to fit. For example, the 212 suffix indicates a 5" 1911 while the 224 suffix indicates a Glock 17. The letter "B" or "H" at the end of the code indicates color. B is for black, H for Havana brown, while no letter generally indicates tan.

Thus, an FL212 (FL + 212 + no letter) will be a tan FLETCH to fit a 5" 1911, while an RG224B (RG + 224 + B) will be a black Royal Guard for a Glock 17.

Codes containing the letter 'R' in the suffix indicate that the holster accommodates most red dot sights. For example, a Paragon 2.0 IWB for the Glock 19 w/wo Red Dot Sight would be marked PA2-226RB.

Holsters intended for Galco's modular shoulder systems display letters and numbers that correspond to guns. A Miami Classic holster intended for a SIG P320, for example, will simply read 820.

The numerical suffix of holsters intended for right-hand or ambidextrous use will end in an even number. The suffix of holsters intended for left-hand use will end in an odd number.

You may use the search field found at our website, galcoholsters.com, to locate a holster fit. Simply enter the model number on the item (FL224B, for example) in the field. Galco's FasTrax PAC[™] is designed to blend with modern casual clothing styles while discreetly carrying a compact or subcompact defensive handgun ready for quick action. This hidden open carry holster allows you to conceal a handgun in plain sight with style! The innovative pivoting holster component works in concert with an activation cord to create a simple, fast draw method that eliminates the need to dig inside the body of the pack to retrieve the handgun. The firearm may be accessed in a traditional manner as well.

The FasTrax PAC is available is two sizes, with the "S" suffix denoting units for subcompact autos and small-frame revolvers, and the "C" suffix indicating units for handguns up to compact autos. The holster component is the same for both sizes, with the difference being the size of the pack interior. The subcompact measures 11 1/2" wide x 5 1/4" high, while the compact measures 11 1/2" wide x 6 1/8" high. The compact will accommodate most red dot sights, while the subcompact will not.

The stretchable elasticized waist strap combines with Galco's Comfort ClothTM backing for the utmost comfort, even in hot weather. The user-adjustable holster component can be configured for dozens of different popular handguns. The FasTrax PAC tops the list for convenient, comfortable concealed carry in an increasingly casually-dressed world.




HOLSTER ADJUSTMENT FOR YOUR FIREARM

WARNING UNLOAD YOUR FIREARM (magazine, chamber, cylinder) before testing holster fit.



The holster component can be adjusted to fit a wide variety of compact and subcompact defensive handguns. Use the numbered and lettered holes corresponding to the list below to select an appropriate fit for your firearm. **See illustration 1.**

The holster component need not be removed to adjust gun fit, but if you wish to remove it please refer to the information at **illustration 2**.




CAUTION Ensure that the adjustable welt is sandwiched between the walls of the holster, secured by both screws and positioned to cradle the trigger guard. A welt turned convex will impede holster fit.


WELT ADJUSTMENTS



WARNING After removing the holster component for any reason, ensure that the holster component fasteners are seated securely within the keyholes/slots on the holster component. Reattach each fastener one at a time by inserting the fastener through the hole of the keyhole/slot.

WARNING The trigger should not be touched and your finger should not enter the trigger guard until your sights are on the target.


DRAWING FROM FASTRAX PAC




WARNING In order to avoid muzzling body parts DO NOT wear the FasTrax PAC centered on your abdomen. When wearing the FasTrax Pac ensure that it is off the centerline of the body, either to the left or the right.



Simultaneously grasp the activation cord with your support hand and the top zipper pull with your primary hand. See illustration 6.








Pull the activation cord **up and towards the centerline** (solar plexus area) of your body. This will rotate the holster almost 90 degrees, with the butt of the firearm coming out of the firearm compartment. **See illustration 8.**


WARNING Do not pull the activation cord to the front or the side, as this can cause the muzzle to cross the support hand during the draw. The smoothest, safest draw method is to pull the activation cord up and towards the centerline of the body.

DRAWING FROM FASTRAX PAC CONTINUED




Grasp the butt of the firearm in a firing grip while keeping your trigger finger straight. Pull the firearm up and out of the holster, while simultaneously releasing the activation cord from the support hand. Allow the activation cord to fall away from the support hand. Your


support hand should remain in position on your chest. See illustration 9. Once the firearm is pointed towards the target and before extending your arms, grip the firearm with both hands using a proper shooting grip as taught by an accredited firearms safety and training course.



HOLSTERING



1. Return your support hand to the center of your chest while visually confirming that the holster is not obstructed and in the vertical position. See illustration 10.



2. With your finger well clear of the trigger and along firearm's frame, gently ease the firearm into the holster. See illustration 11.




3. Slowly seat the firearm completely in the holster. **See illustration 12.**




4. Pivot the firearm and holster component so it is completely enclosed in the holster compartment. See illustration 13.

LEFT HAND CONVERSION




The FasTrax PAC comes configured for right hand use. To convert to left hand use, remove and reverse the holster by shifting the holster component until the post of the fastener is within the hole of the keyhole slot. Release the holster fasteners one at a time. See illustration 2.




Untie the knot at the end of the activation cord and pass the cord through the indicated holes in the order shown. Tie a secure knot at the end of the activation cord. See illustration 3.

LEFT HAND CONVERSION CONTINUED



When converting from right hand to left hand operation, ensure that the holster fastener spacers are moved to the opposing holster fasteners. The spacers help ensure that the firearm does not hang up during the draw. See illustration 4 & 5.



PRO TIP!




There are two zipper pulls on the firearm compartment, one for right hand and one for left hand use. During use, ensure that the unused zipper pull is tucked into the holster compartment while the active zipper pull remains free to grasp. See illustration 15.



The exterior accessory pocket features a convenient pass-through port for head-phone or other cables.
