

**DANGER**

Firearms users must understand and obey the Rules of Firearm Safety:

- Treat all firearms as if they are always loaded.**
- Never point a firearm at anything you aren’t willing to shoot.**
- Keep your finger off the trigger until you intend to shoot.**
- Be sure of your target and what is behind/beyond it.**

Read and understand all owner’s manuals, instructions, and guides prepared by the manufacturer of your firearm prior to use. **WARNING**


Carrying a firearm with an ill-fitting or improper holster can result in serious injury or death. The purchase and use of a Galco holster is at the sole and exclusive risk of the user.

READ AND UNDERSTAND THIS ENTIRE GUIDE PRIOR TO USING THIS PRODUCT


Firearms are inherently dangerous. Improper or careless use of a firearm or firearm and holster may result in serious injury or death. It is the user’s responsibility to possess a thorough knowledge of, and be properly trained in, all aspects of firearm use, including holster use and safety.

Carry the firearm in the safe condition recommended by its manufacturer. This information will be contained in the product information manual provided by the firearm manufacturer. If you do not have the manual applicable to the firearm, contact the firearm’s manufacturer.

It is the user’s responsibility to maintain the holster by regularly checking component parts for excessive wear and proper function.

**WARNING**


Failure to heed these warnings or follow the operating instructions may result in negligent discharge of a firearm, causing serious injury or death.

**WARNING**


Do not in any way modify, disassemble or remove any part from this holster, except as approved and recommended in Galco’s Product Information Guide.

Always place your hand on the firearm when you are performing other physically vigorous activities.


Checking tension units each time the holster is used is required as part of your regular safety inspection. Applying a small amount of clear nail polish to the threads of the tension units, after proper adjustment, will help minimize screw loosening.

**WARNING**


Tension units are not pre-set at the factory. If a holster has tension units, it is the user’s responsibility to ensure they are adjusted to retain the firearm.


**CAUTION**

Always protect an exposed magazine release from accidental activation.


**WARNING**

When drawing a firearm or engaging it with the holster, DO NOT place your finger on the trigger, in the trigger guard, or near the trigger. Position your finger along the frame of the firearm above the trigger guard. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on target.




**WARNING**


If the firearm is not properly secured by means of friction from the holsters molding or of the retention device(s), it could become dislodged, causing injury and possibly death to the user and others.

**WARNING**

A firearm (whether in or out of a holster) may discharge if it falls to the ground or onto another object, causing death or serious injury. Holsters are not designed or intended to prevent firearms from discharging when dropped.


**WARNING**

A holster is not a replacement for a safe. Firearms should be secured in a locked safe when not in use. Firearms should not be stored in holsters for long periods, even when in a safe. The holster may trap moisture against the firearm and promote corrosion.


**WARNING**

A significant number of negligent discharges - some resulting in injury or death - occur while holstering a firearm. Most are caused by the user’s index finger pressing the trigger. Some are caused because a foreign object becomes entangled or trapped in the trigger guard/holster and presses the trigger. The safest practice is to “look the firearm into the holster”. This should be done methodically and without rushing. While holstering, be fully cognizant that:

- All safeties are engaged.
- Your index finger is straight along the firearm’s frame. DO NOT place your finger on the trigger, in the trigger guard, or near the trigger. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on the target.
- No articles of clothing (shirt tails, jacket drawstrings, etc.) become trapped in the trigger guard, holster, or between the firearm and holster.
- Your shooting-hand thumb is placed over the hammer or the rear of the slide. This will enable you to feel if the hammer starts to move rearward or the slide begins to come out of battery.
- You strictly observe Rule of Firearms Safety #2: never point a firearm at anything you aren’t willing to shoot. If you do not know how to holster your firearm without breaking this rule, you should seek training before holstering your firearm while the holster is worn.
- If for any reason you are unable to “look the firearm into the holster” and not muzzle yourself or others, you should remove the holster from your body, then “look the firearm into the holster” (without breaking Rule #2). After the firearm is securely seated in the holster, attach the holster to your body/clothing in the manner in which it was designed.
- If you holster your firearm while the holster is off and in your hand , insure you do NOT point the firearm at your support hand. Do not place your support hand (or other body parts) at the bottom of the holster. The holster material is not bullet proof. Neither your support hand, other body parts, nor other people should be muzzled/flagged while holstering.




CARRY CONDITION OF THE FIREARM


**WARNING**

Some single-action revolvers and some semi-automatic pistols must be carried with the hammer or firing pin resting on an empty chamber.


Carrying any firearm with a live cartridge in the chamber immediately in front of the firing pin may cause a negligent discharge. Information regarding the safe carry condition of your firearm will be contained in the product information manual provided by the firearm’s manufacturer. If you are unsure of the safe carry condition(s) of your firearm, contact the firearm’s manufacturer.

**WARNING**


Never holster a firearm in the single-action mode, unless it is a semi-automatic pistol and holster designed and intended for “cocked and locked” or “Condition One” carry. Always ensure that a single-action pistol carried in “Condition One” has the manual safety engaged when carrying in a holster.

**WARNING**

Do not use customized, modified, worn or broken firearms, or those otherwise outside the original manufacturer’s specifications, with a Galco holster.

**WARNING**

Do not place a loaded firearm in a holster without first testing - with a firearm double-checked and verified to be unloaded - for proper firearm fit.

**CAUTION**

Do not attempt to cock a holstered firearm as this may damage the firearm, the holster, or both and may contribute to a negligent discharge.

Galco has made every effort to properly label all holsters for the specific firearms they fit. However, firearms manufacturers often make changes to their firearms that affect holster fit.

Galco will not be responsible for such changes, nor for typographical or other human errors that may occur. It is the user’s responsibility to ensure proper holster fit with actual firearms.

It is important to understand that all products, including firearms, holsters and slings may eventually “wear out” or become unsuitable for the function for which they were designed. Stress and strain placed on a product will vary according to frequency and conditions of use, and therefore it is difficult to indicate a recommended replacement date for this product.

HOLSTER FIT WITH RED DOT OPTICS (MRDO)

Holster models designed to accommodate carry-style micro red dot optic (MRDO) sights are denoted by the “R” in the product code’s suffix. For example, a Concealable 2.0 belt holster for the Glock 19 and compatible with an MRDO will be indicated by the product code CO2-226R.

Galco is continuously adding to our new holster designs and retrofitting existing designs, where possible, to accommodate MRDO sights. Most true MRDOs are compatible with Galco holsters denoted by an “R”, depending on design, size and location on the slide or top strap (of a revolver).

However, large-window and/or cantilevered competition-oriented optics may not fit all Galco holsters. Current examples of competition-oriented optics include the Trijicon SRO, Holosun 507 Comp, and Swampfox Justice II. Note that, even though a large optic may fit in one Galco holster model, it may not work in another model.

PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION

Galco products are generally identified with a two-part code stamped into the holster body or label affixed to the item.

An alphabetical or alphanumeric prefix identifies the holster model. For example, the FLETCH model’s prefix is FL while the Royal Guard’s prefix is RG.

The numerical suffix identifies the particular firearm the holster is intended to fit. For example, the 212 suffix indicates a 5” 1911 while the 224 suffix indicates a Glock 17. The letter “B” or “H” at the end of the code indicates color. B is for black, H for havana brown, while no letter generally indicates tan.

Thus, an FL212 (FL + 212 + no letter) will be a tan FLETCH to fit a 5” 1911, while an RG224B (RG + 224 + B) will be a black Royal Guard for a Glock 17.

Codes containing the letter ‘R’ in the suffix indicate that the holster accommodates most carry-style micro red dot optics (MRDO). For example, a tan Concealable 2.0 belt holster for the Glock 19 w/wo MRDO would be marked CO2-226R.

Holsters intended for Galco’s modular shoulder systems display letters and numbers that correspond to guns. A Miami Classic holster intended for a SIG P320, for example, will simply read 820.

The numerical suffix of holsters intended for right-hand or ambidextrous use will end in an even number. The suffix of holsters intended for left-hand use will end in an odd number.

You may use the search field found at our website, **galcoholsters.com**, to locate a holster fit. Simply enter the model number on the item (FL224RB, for example) in the field.

⚠ WARNING Holsters designed and specified for a firearm with a rail-mounted light, trigger-guard mounted laser or light, or any other device mounted on its rail, trigger guard or other location on the firearm fully or partially enclosed by the holster (when holstered) should not be used with a firearm without the light, laser or other device attached to the firearm. Using the holster with the firearm only, without the attached accessory device may reduce the holster’s retention properties, resulting in firearm loss and/or subsequent discharge.

Our saddle leather products are made from natural full grain steerhide that are range bred and grown. Therefore, there may be natural range markings in the grain of the saddle leather. This is normal for full-grain steerhide and adds to the beauty and character of your Galco leather product. These same natural range markings may also appear in our genuine horsehide.

Premium Center Cut Steerhide™ is steerhide with the outer and inner layers removed. It has been treated at the tannery in such a way as to retain its natural lateral strength and, at the same time, provide a soft inner layer to protect the firearm’s finish. It also has an outer layer finish that is ideal for inside the waistband and pocket holsters due to its natural “grabbing” ability. Center Cut Steerhide works equally well for general holster designs because its exterior does not show scuffing or scratches.

INSPECTIONS + MAINTENANCE, ADDITIONAL USER RESPONSIBILITIES

⚠ WARNING It is the user’s responsibility to ensure that the Galco product remains serviceable and safe, and able to continue service within its design intent.

NOTICE It is the user’s responsibility to inspect the holster before and after each use for signs of excessive wear or loss of retention capability, and appropriate tightness of all hardware.

DO

NOTICE Ensure that all screws are tightened snugly. Applying a small amount of clear nail polish to the threads will minimize screw back out. Ensure that the holster provides secure gun retention in all circumstances.

Clean as needed progressively by wiping with a soft cloth, soft bristle brush, soft damp cloth, soft damp cloth with mild soap to remove stubborn grime. Do not saturate with water and do not run under the tap.

DON’T

⚠ WARNING Do not use a loaded firearm in a holster without first testing – with a firearm double-checked and verified to be unloaded – for proper firearm fit.

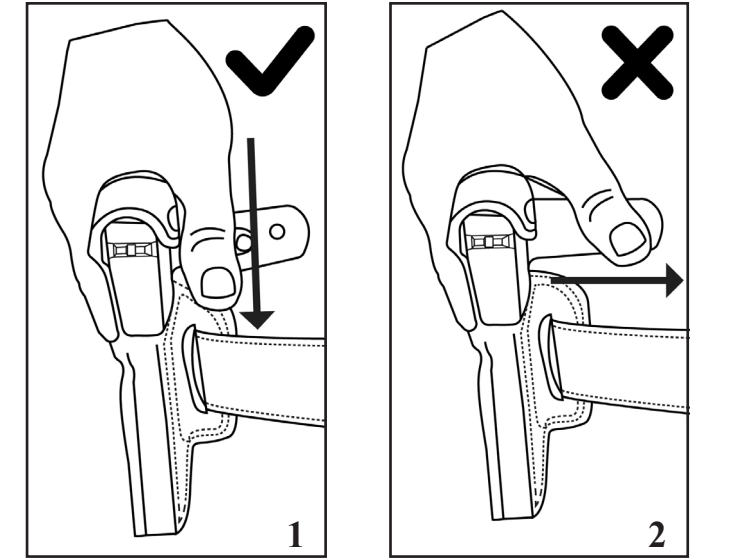
NOTICE Do not put Galco synthetic or leather products in the washing machine. Do not use any solvents or corrosive chemicals on this product.

Do not use artificial heat to speed up the drying process, i.e. from a hair-dryer, oven, radiator, direct sunlight, etc. Do not leave Galco products on the dashboard of your car in the summertime. Do not leave Galco products exposed to direct sunlight or excessive heat for long periods of time.

Do not use LocTite® or threadlock. Outgassing from these adhesive compounds will adversely affect plastic, nylon and rubber parts.

The above care and maintenance instructions cannot substitute for your good common sense. Following our recommended care and maintenance tips will allow you to get the maximum service life from all of your Galco products.

RELEASING A THUMB BREAK STRAP



Proper technique for releasing a thumb break retention strap is to drive the thumb briskly straight down through the snap (fig. 1). This fast, single motion will wedge the strap apart and place the thumb in the correct position to achieve a full firing grip prior to the draw.

Do not attempt to release the thumb break by pushing the strap apart with a sideways motion of the thumb (fig. 2). This is not only more difficult, it is slower and clumsier.

ONE WAY SNAP

Galco uses secure Pull-The-DOT and Lift The Spot snaps, commonly known as one-way snaps, on many products. The purpose of one-way snaps is to prevent opening/unsnapping from one side. Galco typically uses these snaps on some belt loops, in order to prevent unintentional unsnapping of holster/ammo carrier from belt. Once you know the simple trick to operating a one-way snap, it’s very easy.

One-way snaps are fastened by using a downward rolling motion and must be started at their flat spot.

Step 1: Socket and Stud Identification

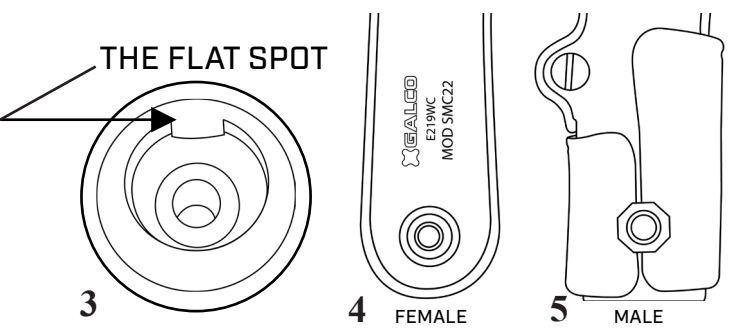
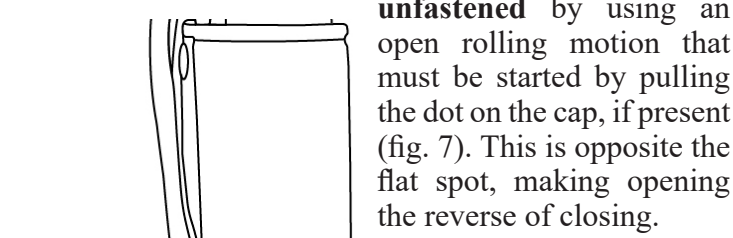


Fig. 3, (female) socket flat spot close-up

Step 2: Snapping Closed

Insert by hooking the edge of the stud under the socket’s flat spot and rolling the remainder of the socket downward until fully snapped (fig. 6).

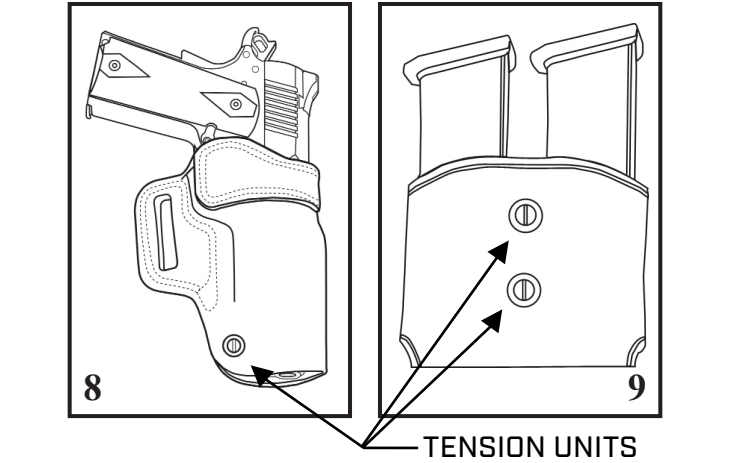


HOLSTER FIT / BREAK-IN ♣

Galco’s full grain leather holsters are made of the finest materials and are precision molded to specific firearms. It may appear the holster fit is too tight at first, but this is by design. We engineer our holsters to fit tightly knowing the leather fibers will relax to the proper fit with use.

⚠ WARNING **UNLOAD YOUR FIREARM** (magazine, chamber, cylinder) before testing holster fit.

Tension units (see figs. 8 & 9 for example tension units). are not pre-set at the factory. You may need to adjust them in order to holster your handgun or magazine for the first time. We recommend that you check your tension screw adjustments before each use. Do not use LocTite® on tension units. However, a single drop of clear nail polish applied to your tension screw threads may reduce its unwanted loosening. It’s unnecessary to remove your tension units for adjustment or during use.



If the fit is too tight when holstering your firearm the first time don’t force it. If you do force the firearm into the holster, it may be very difficult to remove. Instead, follow these simple steps to break in your new holster using a process called blocking:

1. Place the unloaded firearm in a heavy duty Ziploc® type bag, or cover it in 2-3 layers of plastic kitchen wrap. Do not cover the grip.
2. Insert the bagged/wrapped firearm slowly into the holster, gently twisting it side-to-side to minimize tearing of the bag/wrap.
3. Once the firearm is completely seated in the holster, twist approximately 1/16” in both directions 6-12 times.
4. Allow the bagged/wrapped firearm to sit in the holster for approximately 15 minutes.
5. Remove the firearm from the holster and remove the bag/wrap from the firearm.

HOLSTER FIT / BREAK-IN (continued)

6. Insert the unloaded firearm into the holster, which should now be snug but not loose. If it still too tight, repeat the above steps until the holster is broken in to your satisfaction.
7. If necessary, repeat steps 1-6 with an additional heavy duty Ziploc type bag or additional 2-3 layers of plastic kitchen wrap.

NOTICE If your holster has a retention strap: You may need to stretch the retention strap using your fingers only (no tools, no water, no chemicals, etc.) before you get it to snap.

1. Place the unloaded firearm in the holster.
2. Hold the firearm grip in your strong hand and the retention strap in your support hand.
3. Prepare the strap for stretching by grasping the snap and pulling the strap taut (removing the slack).
4. Twist the strap 90 degrees back and forth in a clockwise and counterclockwise rotation 10-12 times while keeping it taut.
5. Firmly push the firearm away from you while pulling on the strap and continue rotating the strap.
6. Release the tension for a moment and repeat two or three times.
7. Pull the strap over the back of the firearm without releasing tension.
8. While maintaining the strong tension, attempt to snap the retention strap closed.
9. Repeat step 5 as needed.

Following and repeating the above instructions is the only way to an ideal break-in and long service life with proper fit that will last many years.

It is common for the inside of a leather holster to scratch from a single holstering (called etching). A smooth leather lined holster will be even more subject to this normal occurrence. After this initial etching, the holster will custom fit your firearm.

Some modern pistols have very sharp edges, particularly surrounding the ejection port. This may cause an initial feeling of “dragging” on the draw, but will normally resolve quickly with just a few draw-and-holster repetitions.

Try our Draw-Ez™ applied to the inside of your leather holster to shorten the break-in period and provide a slicker draw. Draw-Ez only treats the interior surface of the leather and will not be absorbed by the leather or harm the finish. Do not use Draw-Ez on Premium Centercut Steerhide.
